Green - paper money

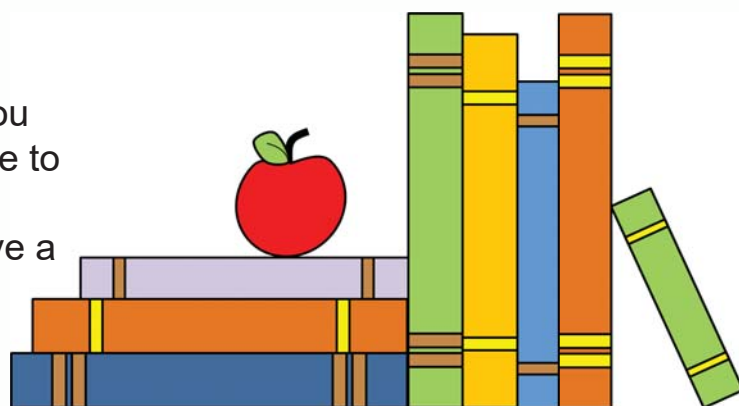
Moola - money

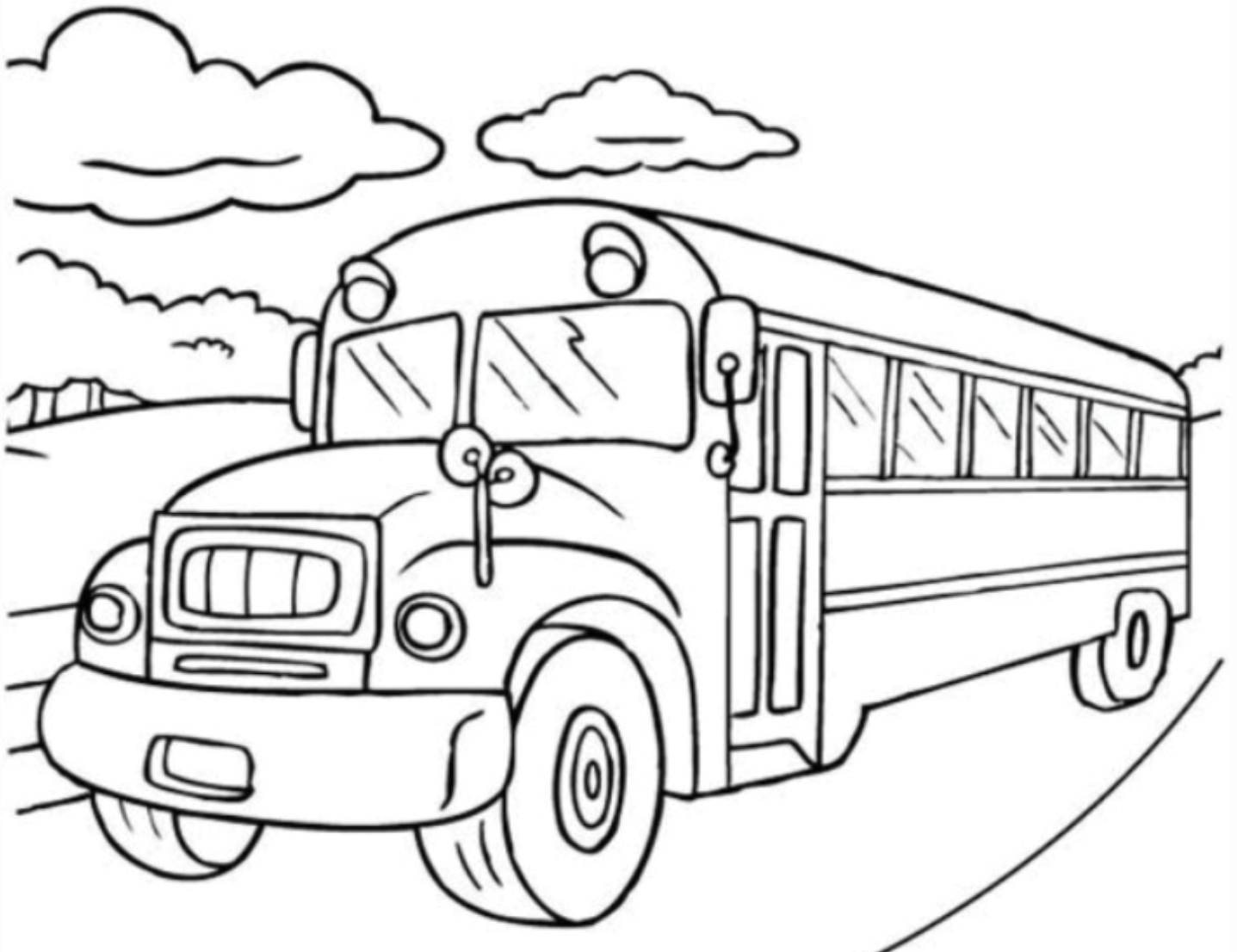
